Jon has extensive knowledge of the issues affecting families in Dorset, along with the organisations offering help and support. Do come along and hear about the work going on in YOUR AREA.



## Dorset Historic Churches "Ride and Stride", 13th September

Many thanks to all who generously sponsored Eric Young for <u>this event</u>. He cycled about 36 miles and visited 25 churches. He expects to raise almost £400, half of which will go to <u>Dorset Historic Churches</u> <u>Trust</u> and half to Dorchester United Church. Thanks also to Shawn Board, our organiser, and those who helped him staff the Church on the day.

From Rev John Yarrien: I visited 9 churches in total, cycling 15 miles in just over 2 hours. I visited several churches in Dorchester in a circular route that took me from UCD, across to the Catholic church, St Peter's, over to St George's, to Stinsford, then to West Stafford, West Knighton, then on to Broadmayne, before heading back into Dorchester to my final stop at St Mary's Church in Edward Road. I am very grateful for the donations that have been made. I have collected £200, which is amazing. Next year I hope to be a little more ambitious, but this was a challenging and affirming start to my Ride and Stride journey. Thank you for all the encouragement.
