Re-opening the Church

Opening for private prayer has been satisfactory from a safety point of view. Although only a few people have come, people passing on the street have certainly noticed that we are open. We are now going to move on to showing the YouTube service and eventually having live worship again, although without singing.

Starting on Sunday, 26th July, we are going to show the YouTube service on the big screen at 10.00am. All are welcome but this will particularly benefit those who are not online. Because of social distancing, we can have a maximum of about 45 people, so you will have to book. If more than 45 want to come, we will repeat the service at 11.15am. The first service should finish by 10.40am, allowing time for the chairs to be sanitised before the second congregation arrive. People will have to use the hand sanitiser when they arrive, and they will have to wear masks. To book a place, please contact Gillian Daniel by 6pm on the day before.

We hope to start live worship on Sunday, 16th August, with the same arrangements as for the YouTube service, i.e. people have to book for the 10.00am service, which will be repeated at 11.15am if more than 45 want to come. We hope that the service will be live-streamed as well. The service will, like the YouTube and Zoom services, last only about 35-40 minutes. Sadly, there will be no refreshments after the service.

We shall continue opening for private prayer on Wednesdays, but from 10.30am to 11.30am starting on the 29^{th} July.

Wendy will produce a rota for door stewards using existing volunteers to the end of August. Normal rotas for door stewards will commence from the start of September, but only with those who are willing to take part.

Live-streaming our services from mid-August will prepare us for live-streaming the Induction Service on Tuesday, 1st September. With the severe restriction on how many we can accommodate, and 40 places needed for John and Ruth's families and circuit and church representatives, attendance by UCD members will unfortunately be by invitation only.

- 1. To book a place, please contact Gillian Daniel, by 6pm on the day before.
- 2. Seats will be allocated on a first come first served basis. When the seat allocation is full for the 10am service, and only then, booking for a second service at 11.15 will be opened.
- 3. Doors will open on South Street at 9.40 for 10am service. You may have to queue. Please do not use the Charles Street entrance.
- 4. Please put on your mask before entering the church foyer.
- 5. When requested by the steward please enter the foyer and sanitise your hands.
- 6. Please maintain social distancing.
- 7. Please go to your numbered seat using the marked walkways.
- 8. When it is time to leave please let the buggies and wheelchairs leave first by the South Street entrance.
- 9. Everyone else please wait until the steward has indicated that your row can leave. Exit via the door to the right hand side of the organ and down the side passage exit back to South Street.

Apologies for all the guidelines, but we are working to keep everyone as safe as possible while the Covid virus is still around.

Church Shop

Good News! The church shop has re-opened and we are looking forward to welcoming you again. Currently the shop is open on **Wednesdays only** for the usual hours of **10am -12.30pm**. We have put in place some changes which we hope will help to keep us all as safe as possible from spreading or acquiring covid-19. These include limiting the number of customers in the shop at any one time, providing sanitisers, and suggesting that face coverings be worn. (**Please note: t**here will be no access to any other part of the building: there will therefore be **no access to the toilets**.)
