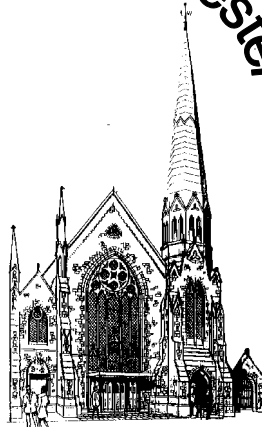

Welcome and Induction Service for Rev John Yarrien and Rev Ruth Lownsborough

Tuesday, 1st September at 7pm

This service was to have taken place at UCD and be live-streamed, but technical problems have meant that live-streaming is not possible, so it has been decided that the service should take place by Zoom.

Services in the Next Quarter

In the next quarter, September to November, our Sunday services will continue to be at 10am and last about 40 to 45 minutes, and with no singing. Because of social distancing we can accommodate a maximum of 45 people, so you will have to book. If more than 45 want to come, the service will be repeated at 11.15am after all the chairs have been sanitised. People will have to use the hand sanitiser when they arrive, and they will have to wear masks. Please note that Gillian has changed her personal telephone number since the church directory was last published, and her old number has now been re-assigned. You **must** therefore use the church office number when phoning through your request.

There will not be a formal collection. Please place your gift on a plate either in the foyer as you enter or near the door at the front as you leave. If you have difficulty hearing, please let us know. Unfortunately we have now found that live-streaming will not be possible but we will be recording the service and hope to put it onto YouTube every week. Due to the positioning of the camera, no members of the congregation appear in the video.

Communion

We hope that you appreciate that we have been very cautious in re-opening the church, first for private prayer, then for the YouTube service and now for live worship. The distribution of the bread and wine in communion services, if we were to follow our usual practice, would be completely unacceptable under current guidelines. We decided that we needed to talk to our new minister, Rev John Yarrien, about a method of distribution which would be covid-safe, and then do a risk assessment. We were therefore surprised to find communion services on the new plan, and certainly not one as early as the beginning of September. The service on the 6th September will not be a communion service. The services at the beginning of October and November may include communion. It is likely to be a “dry” communion, that is with bread but not wine for the congregation, but, be assured, we shall go ahead only if we can find a safe method of distribution.

Market Day Services

Starting on Wednesday, 2nd September, we shall once again have services on Wednesday mornings, starting at 10.30am and lasting about 20 minutes. Of course, we shall not be able to sing, but Heather hopes to be available for these services to play and sing for us. Masks must be worn and hand sanitiser used, as on Sundays. Since the usual congregation is no more than 20 people, we shall not have a booking system.
