Booking for December services We hope to be able to return to worship with two services from Sunday 6 December. Remember you can book in advance for December Sunday services. Please let Gillian know before the beginning of the month. If there are any of the Sundays when you know you will be away or you are on duty and will already have a designated seat, please make sure Gillian knows as we anticipate December will be busy, especially the carol service on 20 December. Gillian will be available to take bookings before and after most services in December. You do not need to book for the

Christmas Eve Midnight Communion service, but you will need to make a separate booking for Christmas Day as this is not a Sunday. Depending on lockdown restrictions we foresee that there may be larger family groups. As for Christingle (see later notice) you can book up to a maximum of 5 in one household group to sit together. We will do our best to move chairs to accommodate this.

Thursday 24 December at 3pm and 4.15pm

As yet, we don't know what the guidance will be in December. However, plans are afoot for a Christingle with a difference. Everyone will be provided with a DIY Christingle bag and we will all make our Christingles together, but in our own seat with families socially distanced to keep everyone of all ages safe. The atmosphere of Christmas approaching and all being peaceful and ready will still be the same.

As with most of our services now, you will need to book for one of the two Christingle services. Families of up to 5 (inclusive of adults and children) will be able to sit in their household bubble. If carers or grandparents are bringing children without parents, they will be able to sit in a bubble (max 5). If your household is greater than 5, please let us know as we may have to split the group depending on the number and sizes of households that have booked. The maximum number we can accommodate safely at each service is 45.

Please book a minimum of a week before the service by contacting Wendy Hilton. When you arrive for the service you will be shown where you are sitting as the logistics are quite complex.

Carol Service - Covid edition

Our carol service this year will be a little different from previous years. It will be on Sunday 20th December at 10am and 11.15am. As the congregation is not allowed to sing, we would like to add an extra dimension to the service by including members of the congregation who are artists and craftspeople. We are inviting people who have produced Christmas themed art work, models, wall hangings etc to either take a picture of their work to be displayed on PowerPoint during the service or, if the item is big enough, bring the item to be displayed in the church.

One Way Christmas Fair in aid of Mission Aviation Fellowship Wednesday 9th December 1.30 – 3.30pm and Thursday 10th December 10am – 12 noon Christmas crafts, books, gifts, cakes and refreshments, and the church shop will be open

We hope that Covid restrictions will allow us to provide a fair with a difference. You will enter through South Street where we will have the Christmas craft stall. Then through the church into the corridor where there will be a gift stall, books in the Quiet Room, then into the hall for the cake stall and refreshments and out towards Charles Street, where the church shop will be open. There will be stewards throughout the fair maintaining safe distancing. On entering the hall you will need to give your details for Track and Trace, and refreshments will be in groups of six at a maximum. All cakes donated must be wrapped and there will be no bric-a-brac stall due to space restrictions and the current difficulty of disposing of unsold items. Donations for the stalls can be brought to the hall on the Wednesday morning.

Dorchester Family Support (formerly School Holiday Lunch Club)

Dorchester Family Support are organising Christmas food hampers for our families who we know will still need help this December. We really hope that people will once again support us. We have put together a list of foodstuffs that we will need. We try to make each hamper as uniform as possible so here are some of the items that we know are well received:

Small Christmas/fruit cake, chocolate, cheese biscuits, jelly/trifle mix, coffee, hot chocolate and Christmas puddings (crisps and mince pies have been deleted – see below). If you can think of anything else that is "Christmassy" don't be afraid to include it. The bin for donations is currently in the South Street foyer and will be there on a Wednesday and Sunday, but when the shop reopens it will be there on the other days. All donations need to be received by Sunday 12 December.

UCD has just heard from the charity that Thomas Hardye School is unable to provide basic hampers this year, but will be providing mince pies and crisps. Tesco are also unable to help with sourcing additional items this year, so the charity will be using Waitrose. This Christmas will be especially difficult for those who have lost their jobs, or have fallen through the cracks of the financial help available. Please, if everyone in church could just donate one item, it could make a huge difference to our local families. Thank you.

A wealth of information in the new UCD website members' area

Di, our admin coordinator, and Kevin, our webmaster, have spent many hours over the last few months developing a password protected area on our website and loading it with useful information. Things like: who's on what rota and when; addresses in the church directory; our governing documents; annual reports, church meeting minutes and AGM minutes for the last five years; who's who on the Council of Stewards; policies and procedures in the church and, very soon, a regularly updated diary of bookings in the UCD buildings. You can use all these resources if you can access the internet and if you have already completed the UCD consent form, which gives us permission to hold your contact details on the church database. The majority of you will have done this about three years ago. (Due to data protection legislation, the church database is not accessible on the web.)
