Monthly news sheet and Vision magazine

The stewards and pastoral committee both met recently to look at how we gradually reopen as the Covid guidelines change. It is also a time to relook at what we do and how we do it. We all know the slogan "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle". The pastoral committee have been looking at how we can reduce our use of paper.

Over the last year the majority of people have been looking at the monthly news sheet online, while some without computer access have been having it delivered. The news sheet will continue to be available online, so we want to see if we can reduce the numbers printed. It will be available in the shop and in the church foyers and by the side door, but **after the service please**. At the moment too much is happening in the foyer at the start of the service with people having to sanitise hands, find a mask and check their seat booking. Also by leaving the news sheet in a pile for individuals to collect, it is not being handled several times.

If you are a volunteer who has been printing at home and delivering the news sheet over the last year, please check if those you deliver to can now collect their own. Also, rather than continue to print at home, pick up the number you need. We want everyone to have a news sheet, but in the most environmentally friendly way, which is also Covid safe.

The next Vision magazine, which will come out in mid-May, will continue to be delivered by our Covid network of deliverers. However, by mid-July when the Aug/Sept magazine is due to be delivered, all Covid restrictions should have been lifted and so our pastoral visitors hopefully can resume their role of delivering the magazine. We will let you have details when we know more.

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK: MAY 10-16 UPDATE

Because of current national guidelines we have had to postpone the ecumenical service scheduled for the United Church on Sunday 9 May, the Christian Aid Market on Wednesday 12 May and house-to-house collections.

We have re-scheduled the **service for 17 October at 4 pm** and the **Market for 16 October** when, hopefully, our activities will be less restricted and they can run more closely to what was the norm before the pandemic.

Because we have had to abandon house-to-house collections we will have to rely very heavily on contributions in envelopes on the seats or on-line. If you would like to donate on-line then please contact info@christian-aid.org for details about giving and claiming gift aid.

The **annual collection in South Street (on Friday 14 May)** will still go ahead but using collecting buckets on the pavement rather than collection tins and with collectors wearing masks. We do need volunteers to help with this so if you feel you could give an hour during the day at some time between 9.00 am and 4.00 pm we would be very grateful. We hope another important fund-raiser this year will be the **Walk to the River Jordan**, an eight mile walk from **St Peter's Church to Bowleaze Cove** starting at **9.30** am on **Saturday 15 May**. We would be delighted to see as many people as possible sponsored to support Christian Aid or just for the enjoyment of the walk. Further details and sponsorship forms are available from Tony Boyden (<u>Christian Aid Contact</u>). Or even if you are unable to join us, Christian Aid has suggested other forms of sponsorship, e.g. a 100,000, 200,000 or 300,000 step challenge for May, perhaps, or covering a virtual distance in miles over the month, for instance between Dorchester and London.
