Replacing the Revd Peter Clark

The Revd Peter Clark will retire at the end of September. The Circuit Leadership Team (CLT) has been planning how we try to replace him, but the final decision lies with the Circuit Meeting which meets next at Weybay at 7.30pm on Tuesday, 14th September.

The first idea was to try to get another full-time URC minister. There were doubts about whether the circuit could afford a full-time replacement, hence the suggestion, which we looked at very seriously, that we should share a full-time appointment with Hope and Radipole URC churches in Weymouth. They had been trying without success for several years to secure a half-time URC minister. Together we hoped to obtain a full-time minister. Then the URC Wessex Synod made a decision in July 2020 that no new vacancies could be advertised. We thought at first that this would be a temporary policy whilst they brought out a more sophisticated alternative, but this has not happened. Then, at last, Hope and Radipole obtained the half-time minister which they wanted, so any scheme to join with them has now been ruled out.

Although there are many possible schemes, the circuit is now looking very seriously at two possibilities. The first is to go into the Methodist stationing process to obtain a full-time Methodist minister. The second is to seek a part-time appointment which, we hope, would attract a retired URC minister. Each has points in its favour as well as drawbacks.

The closing date for entering the stationing process is 23rd September, and, if we were successful, the new minister would arrive ready to start in September 2022. Besides having pastoral charge of Bridport and Uploders, the new minister would be expected to spend about 40% of his/her time on mission work at Westham and around the circuit. I agree very strongly with the circuit steward who said that she is fed up with managing decline and wants to be involved in church growth. The cost of a five-year appointment would be £250 000, some of which is likely to be taken out of circuit reserves which currently stand at about £840 000. The circuit has already allocated £50 000 for mission work, from which we at UCD hope to claim for expenses associated with StoryTots, Forest Praise and the County Show. There is a proposal to increase that by another £150 000. That would make the mission post very attractive, but I personally find it difficult to imagine spending even £20 000 per year. The main drawback, as I see it, is that all the ministers will be Methodist when about 55% of the circuit are members of LEPs.

To secure a part-time URC minister, the circuit would simply advertise in the appropriate magazine/journal. This would make two and a half ministers in the circuit, which would be affordable with our present budget and also maintain the URC presence in the circuit. A new minister would start as soon as he/she were available.

There is a national shortage of Methodist ministers so, having two already, our application might very well not be successful. On the other hand, we have seen that it took Hope and Radipole several years to secure a part-time URC minister, so that alternative might equally well not lead anywhere. At the June Circuit Meeting, we were told that it would be possible to go into the stationing process whilst simultaneously advertising for a part-time URC minister, because we could drop out of stationing at any time. When the CLT looked more closely at the stationing documentation, all 84 A4 pages of it, that advice turned out to be incorrect. Once we enter the stationing process, we must stay in until next April.
