Church seating

From October 17th we reduced the space between people at both services to one empty seat. This allows a few more people to attend each service. If you are a couple or group and want to sit beside each other, move one or more of the "do not sit here" cards to create enough space, but leave at least one empty space between your group and the people on each side. Please return the card to its original position when you leave.

You have a free choice of seats. There are no allocated seats except for specific reserved seats (see below). **10 am service.** You will need to notify us at least the day before that you are coming to this service to make sure we don't exceed the total number of seats, but you will not be given an allocated seat. If you already have a season ticket booking, it has been assumed that you will continue to come to this service, but you will not have an allocated seat.

11.15 am service. You do not need to book. You will have a free choice of seats. The balcony can also be used.

Reserved seating at either service. We can reserve you a specific seat, if your hearing is poor, you have another disability, you have a carer with you or you still need more space around you (i.e. two empty seats). You will need to book this seat in advance and a reserved sign will be placed on that specific seat for you.

Church Meeting

Our next Church Meeting will be at 7pm on Thursday, 25th November. Important items on the agenda include agreeing the budget for next year and deciding on the church charity for the next year. Our church charity has been the Mission Aviation Fellowship for the last three years. Normally it is for two years, but the covid crisis made it difficult to give our usual level of support.
