As we look ahead we must also look back and thank God for all that he has done for each one of us and confess all our sins. So a short time of silence for self examination and repentance for all our sins, as we name them before God.

That hymn reminds us of the love and compassion of God but scripture continually reminds us of the sin of man and how we stray from God's ways and how he keeps calling us back to the ways of righteousness and peace.

One of the less well known books in the bible is that of the prophet Zephaniah one of the last and shortest in the Old Testament and can be summarised in these 3 sections but it would be good to read them.

Ch1 v1 -2v3 The Day of the Lords Judgement 2 v 4-15 The doom of Israel's neighbours 3 v 1-20 Jerusalem's doom and redemption.

As we read these scriptures surely we have to ask how God will deal with us. The Jews did not learn all the lessons in the Old Testament, God had to keep on sending the prophets and still they went on sinning. That is why he had to send John the Baptist as a final last call to the people to turn from their sins and welcome and believe in Jesus who was about to start his ministry. Mark Ch1 v 1-3
