

# Dorchester Poverty Action (Registered Charity No. 1198452) Coffee Morning on Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 10-12 noon at United Church Dorchester Refreshments with home-made cakes, stalls and raffle



For over 30 years this charity has been helping local people (DT1 & DT2) at points of crisis by providing emergency grants of up to £250. During Covid the charity has been particularly busy, but now there are different financial pressures with rapidly rising prices of food, fuel and many everyday items. Over the last few months grants have been given for a washing machine, cooker, nursery equipment, school uniform, basic furniture including a bed, and emergency repairs on a car to get to work. During Covid the charity implemented an additional £100 grant to help with fuel poverty and this needs to continue. These relatively small amounts of money can prevent debt, homelessness and acute stress. Please support the group's annual coffee morning to raise money to support more local people in some very difficult situations. Every penny can make a difference, with all money raised locally and spent locally.
