As we come to worship God today let us start by thinking of those whom we know and who are suffering in some way at this time and lift them up to God in prayer, and confess that often we have been so concerned with our own wants and needs that we have not really bothered about other peoples needs and suffering.

Take a time of silence to confess this and anything else that we know would not have been pleasing to God.

In the ministry of Jesus it was usually a friend or relative that brought a person to Jesus for healing but any one who really believes in god can do it. Do not think that you are not able to do such a thing - anyone can do it in love.

Read .2 Kings ch 5 v 1-4 & 7-15

The girl must have had a lot of faith to believe that God would heal a foreigner, but possibly she was the only one who had the message of salvation. The Syrians only thought in terms of human power and found that this did not work for Naaman.

The girl who was a Jew must have been very well respected for such high standing Syrians to act on her word. Naaman was not a Jew and as we know today there is often a lot of suspicion and opposition between people of different faiths.

Today one might expect to be appreciated for helping someone, but if it challenges the healed person's faith or social customs then there could be social tension, reaction, or even persecution in some countries.

How often do we refrain from praying with someone, or inviting them to church for prayer as we know they do not usually go to church and we are afraid that it might be taken as criticism of their way of life and break friendships.

This is nothing new as you will discover when you Read "2 Timothy 2 v 1-7."

How often do we need to remind ourselves that a good Christian has to have the same qualities as a good soldier. Naaman had a difficult lesson to learn - to be obedient to the word of God rather than rely on human position or power.

Read on in the Book of Kings and you will find, as Naaman did , that obedience to the word of God is far more powerful than any human rules or regulations.

I have discovered in life that sometimes prayer is far more powerful than human skills or abilities and authority. I have been very grateful over the years for the skills and cares of doctors and nurses but I have also experienced and witnessed the power of prayer and that God can and will deal with problems that no human power or skill can do.
