## World Day of Prayer

<u>World Day of Prayer</u> is an international, ecumenical prayer movement that invites women, from a different part of the world each year, to prepare a worship service through which their hopes and fears for their country may be brought before the whole world in prayer.

On Friday 3rd March, an estimated 3 million people in over 170 countries and islands will gather to observe this day of prayer, using an order of service written by Christian women in Taiwan and translated into over 60 languages and 1,000 dialects. In the British Isles alone over 6,000 services will be held. The day begins as the sun rises over the island of Samoa and continues until it sets off the coast of American Samoa, some 35 hours later. The theme 'I have heard about your faith' comes from Ephesians ch.1 v.15, in which St Paul writes to the early Christians in Ephesus to encourage them and to pray for them at a time of adversity.

Everyone is welcome to attend the services. The local Dorchester & District World Day of Prayer service will be held on **Friday 3rd March at 10:30 am at <u>St George's Church, Fordington</u>. Coffee and Fairtrade products will be available after the service in St George's Hall.**
