"Do not go about spreading slander among your people.

"'Do not do anything that endangers your neighbour's life. I am the Lord.

"'Do not hate a fellow Israelite in your heart. Rebuke your neighbour frankly so you will not share in their guilt.

"Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbour as yourself. I am the Lord.

Matthew 22: 34-46

The Greatest Commandment

³⁴ Hearing that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, the Pharisees got together. ³⁵ One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"
³⁷ Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Whose Son Is the Messiah?

⁴¹ While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, ⁴² "What do you think about the Messiah? Whose son is he?"

"The son of David," they replied.

⁴³ He said to them, "How is it then that David, speaking by the Spirit, calls him 'Lord'? For he says,

⁴⁴ "'The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet."'

⁴⁵ If then David calls him 'Lord,' how can he be his son?" ⁴⁶ No one could say a word in reply, and from that day on no one dared to ask him any more questions.

Reflection

We have rules in our society for a very good reason; to prevent chaos and enable us to live together in community in such a way that largely benefits people. That said, there are many flaws in human society!!

The Jewish people lived by the Law given to Moses; given by God to teach the people how to be the people of God, how to be a holy nation. The book of Leviticus lays out many details of how the people were to be holy, by the way that they lived and at the conclusion of today's passage come the familiar words, 'Love your neighbour as yourself'.

However, over generations of leadership, the letter of the Law became more important than the spirit of the Law; being holy became directly related to how strictly one kept the Law. Many were not able to keep the Law as required by the religious authorities and so became alienated, pushed to the edges of society. The Law had become required actions which did not touch or involve peoples' hearts. Jesus changed that interpretation of being holy, with his own life of word and action, loving God and others, not only with his heart but with his whole being.

In Matthew's gospel, to try and challenge Jesus, to trap him, the Pharisees come with a question. But such an easy question! What is the greatest commandment?

It's a question a child would have been able to answer. It is part of the Shema, meaning in Hebrew, 'to hear and to obey'.

This is the first prayer a Jewish child learns and the prayer that Jews still pray every day. 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind'.

But what Jesus does is tie the greatest commandment- loving God with heart, mind and strength, with loving one's neighbour, directions for which are laid out in Leviticus. That is how love for God is shown, not just by following the minutiae of the Law, which is what the Pharisees were very keen on but having a heart of compassion for others and acting for their well-being.

The questioning Pharisee seems satisfied with Jesus' answer but Jesus extends the conversation. There is more that Jesus wants to bring into the open, and he asks the Pharisees a question, 'Whose son is the Messiah?'.... knowing full well what their answer would be...'David's Son'.

The Jews believed that the Messiah would come from the Davidic line, royal ancestry. He would be a new king, overthrowing Israel's oppressors, Rome, an earthly conqueror and the one to herald in God's Kingdom....in which the Jews believed that they would be restored to their rightful place of power and authority.

Jesus reveals that there is much more to the Messiah as he quotes words from Psalm 110, a recognised messianic text. Jesus was more than just of royal descent, of David's line. David's son could only be David's Lord if he was the Messiah!

Jesus has already been proclaimed Son of David by the crowd. Now, Jesus declares his identity as Messiah, Son of God...he is David's Lord, not just of David's descent. Jesus' Messianic identity was going to look very different to that that most people were expecting. The Messiah dying on a cross was not on anyone's radar at that time.

BUT It is only as Son of God, that Jesus' death and resurrection can be understood as his supreme love and sacrifice for all creation. This is Jesus' ultimate demonstration of fulfilling God's command to love God and neighbour, with a love so powerful that it can change peoples' hearts and lives.

The command to love God and to love our neighbour involves cost to ourselves, in time, energy, commitment, material resources, letting go of prejudice, regarding others needs before our own. The source of our love comes from God, through our relationship with Jesus...it is God's love that flows through us, out to others and it would be impossible for us to show that kind of love without a relationship with Jesus. Jesus needs to be central to our life, in everything we do, everything we say.

In Leviticus, the call to God's people was to be holy. Our holiness comes from God through faith in Jesus' actions on the cross. Our gratitude, together with power of the Holy Spirit, enables us to love God with heart, mind, soul and strength and our neighbour as ourselves.

Holiness stems from the heart and Jesus has the power to renew our hearts, to be more like him. It doesn't happen all at once, otherwise we would all have perfect loving hearts; we need to keep turning to Jesus, asking him in his grace and mercy to help us change and so renew us.

We are each a work in progress and each time our hearts are renewed, the flow of mercy, love and justice increases, enabling us to love God more, as we love our neighbour more.

Prayer – I invite you to draw a heart shape in the space at the end of this service. Within it, write the name of someone you love and want to pray for. Next write the name of someone whom you find it hard to love or even get on with, outside the first heart. Finally, draw a second heart shape around the first, encompassing the name/s, asking God to enlarge your heart and strengthen your love to include all the people inside your drawing.

Lord our God, give us grace both to hear and to act on the great commandments of your kingdom, that we may love you with all our heart, and love our neighbour as ourselves –today, tomorrow and always. Amen.
