# **Reverse Advent Calendar**

Many of us buy an Advent Calendar each year. We open it each day in December and receive a gift, often of a sweet or chocolate. We are suggesting that this year, as we journey through Advent, we MAKE a small gift each day before we RECEIVE on Christmas Day the greatest gift of all, God's son, Jesus, to be our Saviour.

We hope that each of us will take a jam jar and put a coin in it each day from Advent Sunday, which this year is on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December, until Christmas Day. The coin may be 1p or 5p or 50p or even more; it does not have to be the same amount each day. Please hand the money in on Christmas Day or one of the next three Sundays. All the money will then go to the <u>Food Bank</u>. Obviously, the Food Bank will not receive it before Christmas, but we are assured that they need money all the year round.

Please use one of your own jam jars if you can, but we hope to have spare ones available for you to take on Advent Sunday and the Sunday before, 26<sup>th</sup> November.

### Journey to the Stable 2023

<u>Journey to the Stable</u> is an interactive experience helping to explain the true meaning of Christmas and is ideal for adults and children alike. The journey takes 20 – 30 minutes. There are seven stations focusing on a person or a part of the Christmas story with readings and reflections. At each there is a small activity or object for people to take away, so they leave with a bag of reflections and goodies.

Schools will be coming from Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> to Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> December, 9.30-2.30pm, and public openings will be Saturday 9<sup>th</sup>, Thursday 14<sup>th</sup>, Friday 15<sup>th</sup>, and Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> December, 11-3pm (11-1.30 on the 15<sup>th</sup> as Quiet Christmas is at 3pm).
