Journey to the Stable 2025

We are approaching the time of year when we start to make plans to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Journey to the Stable, which we have done over countless years, is very much part of those plans. School children and the public can go on an interactive journey and be part of the Christmas story.

School dates for this year are Thursday 4th December to Wednesday 10th December, 9.30-2.30 (Market Day 11.30-2.30) but depending on demand from schools we may have to extend and use Thursday 11th December as well for school visits. If not, it will be open to the public on Saturdays 6th & 13th December 11-2, and Friday 12th December 11-1.30 as Quiet Christmas is at 3pm.

We will be setting the Journey up in Church and the Quiet Room on Wednesday 3rd December at 2pm and taking it down on Saturday 13th December after 2pm. We need help with the setting up and public openings. There will be a sheet (with time slots) on the notice board in the Hall for people to sign if they can help to steward the public openings.

School Visits: We need help with the drinks and biscuits that the children have as part of their visit. Last year some of the schools didn't have enough people to go round with a group of children and tell the story using the material that is with each station. We need a couple of people per school visit who would feel comfortable and be able to go round with a group of children and tell the story. We would have a training session to go through the Journey before the school visits. If you can help and would like to be involved, please speak to Peter Jenner as soon as possible.
